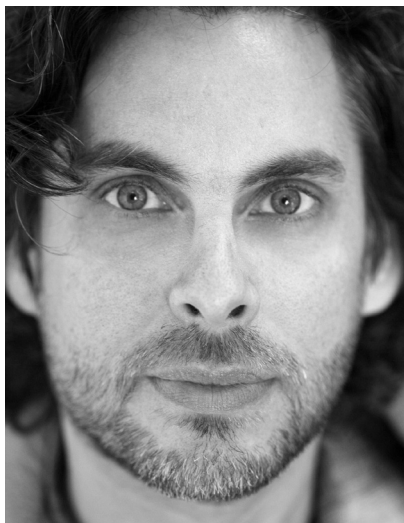

On loan from the Sherwin Miller Museum of Jewish Art, this display features panels reproduced from graphic novels, along with text explaining the history and importance of comics and graphic novels as a means of expression. The exhibit ties in with Michael Chabon's visit as his novel "The Amazing Adventures of Kavalier & Clay" includes Jewish characters who create comics during the 1940s and '50s. The popularity of the book inspired the creation of real graphic novels based on "The Escapist," the comic-book hero invented by characters Joe Kavalier and his cousin Sam Clay in Chabon's novel.
